


Dear Parents,


I am sure that you are well aware from recent headlines of the financial difficulties faced by schools. The National Association of Headteachers (NAHT) has reported that seven out of ten school leaders have indicated that their school budgets will be untenable by the academic year 2019/20. Independent analysis by the Institute of Fiscal Studies has concluded that the amount of spending per pupil in England's schools has fallen by 8% since 2010.

At Nascot Wood Junior School, we pride ourselves on our strategic financial planning, and our ability to target our funding to where it is most needed. When I took over as Headteacher in 2013, the school was in a difficult financial position, and, since then, we have worked hard to ensure that we have had a healthy surplus each year, enabling us to invest in high-quality education for your children.

Through this investment, we achieve the highest outcomes – we are in the top 10% highest attaining schools nationally.

Despite this, it is clear that, going forward, we are going to have to make some tough decisions about how we manage dwindling budgets.





Mathematics Home Learning

Over the last three years, we have invested £21,000 in Maths Whizz for your children's home learning. Many parents have found it a useful resource, particularly the regular reports that they receive.

We are no longer in a position to be able to fund this resource, so we have set out year 6 children to work, researching available resources and their relative prices, so that parents can make an informed choice about the resource in which they want to invest.
