Consistent attendance and punctuality

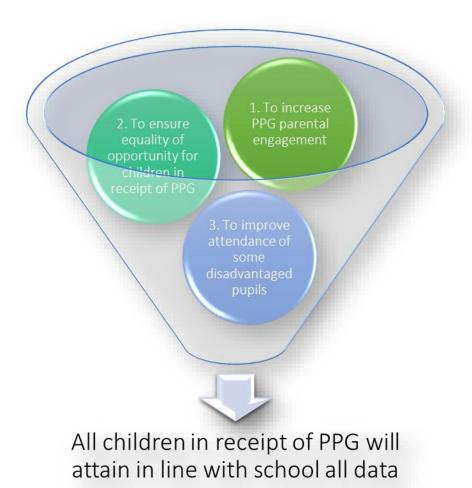
Access to resources such as books, life experiences (particularly cultural)
