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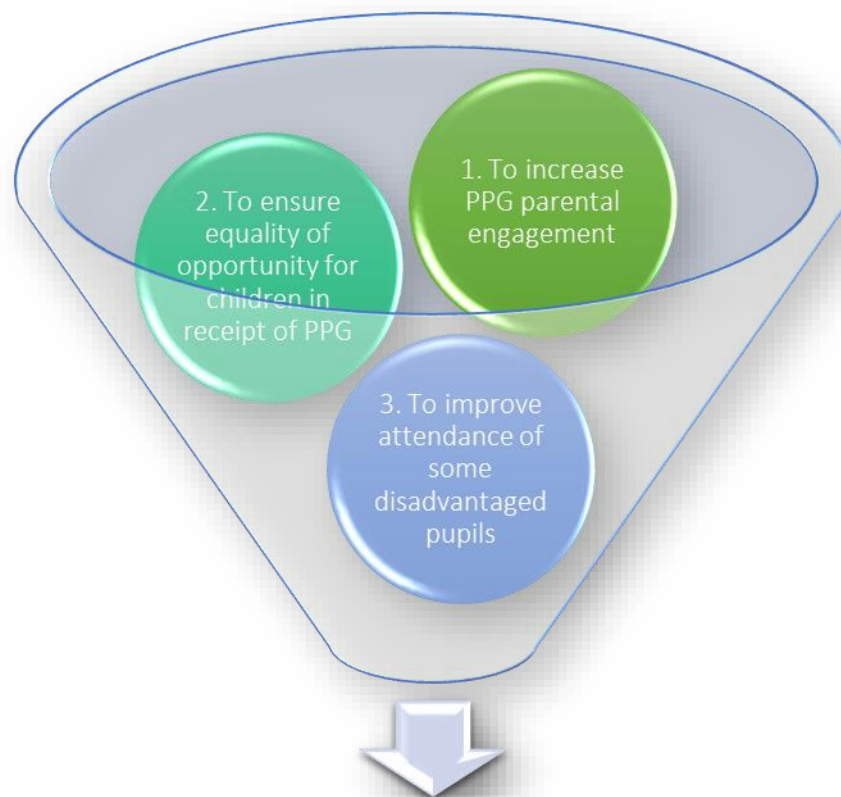

Barriers to future attainment for pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium Grant
In school barriers
Pupils being ready to learn (in a secure place mentally/emotionally)
Gaps in prior learning and/or level playing field with majority of pupils who have additional tutoring
Home school partnership working
External barriers
Consistent attendance and punctuality – analysis of attendance figures shows a slight gap between PPG and non-PPG
Access to resources such as books, life experiences (particularly cultural)
Low aspirations about what can be achieved and how to be successful, and limited access to positive role models
A lack of regular routine including home learning, appropriate sleep, healthy diet
Parental engagement with school and value of education; priority placed upon learning and academic achievement
