
The Nascot News


Charlie and the Chocolate Factory

The James Webb Space telescope (JWST) is a space telescope which was surprisingly launched on Christmas day! How cool is that!



Recipes

Ginger biscuits

Prep: 20 minutes Cook: 10 minutes
Easy Makes 20

Ingredients

- 100g salted butter cubed
- 75g light brown soft sugar
- 1 tbsp grated fresh ginger
- 100g golden syrup
- 250g self-raising flour
- 1½ tbsp ground ginger
- 1 tsp bicarbonate of soda
- 1 small egg yolk, beaten

Method

- STEP 1
- Heat the oven to 190C/170C fan/gas 5. Line two large baking trays with baking parchment. In a saucepan over a low heat, melt the butter, sugar, fresh ginger and golden syrup and leave to cool.
- STEP 2
- Mix the flour, ground ginger and bicarbonate of soda together in a bowl with a wooden spoon. Gradually stir in the cooled sugar mixture and the egg yolk and knead briefly to make a dough.
- STEP 3
- Roll the dough into 20g balls and put on the prepared baking trays with 3cm between each to allow for spreading. Bake for 8-10 mins until golden brown. Leave to cool on the trays for a min, then transfer to a cooling rack to cool completely.

Why not make them into heart shaped biscuits for Valentines Day!



Pancakes

Prep: 10 Minutes Cook: 20 Minutes Easy Makes 12

Ingredients

- 100g plain flour
- 2 large eggs
- 300ml milk
- 1 tbsp sunflower or vegetable oil, plus a little extra for frying
- lemon wedges to serve (optional)
- caster sugar to serve (optional)

• Method

- STEP 1
- Put 100g plain flour, 2 large eggs, 300ml milk, 1 tbsp sunflower or vegetable oil and a pinch of salt into a bowl or large jug, then whisk to a smooth batter.
- STEP 2
- Set aside for 30 mins to rest if you have time, or start cooking straight away.
- STEP 3
- a medium frying pan or crêpe pan over a medium heat and carefully wipe it with some oiled kitchen paper.
- STEP 4
- When hot, cook your pancakes for 1 min on each side until golden, keeping them warm in a low oven as you go.
- STEP 5
- Serve with lemon wedges and caster sugar, or your favourite filling. Once cold, you can layer the pancakes between baking parchment, then wrap in cling film and freeze for up to 2 months.

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

- The Challenge:
- To 'Create' a Bird' using 4 sheets of plain or coloured A4 paper only (from your recycling bin/crate)
- Get the children to work either in pairs at school or individually at home
- Children can only use scissors and their engineering skills to create their birds - research different types of birds, their colours, shapes, what they feed on etc

This year we would like the children to name their bird and tell us about it - where it is from, what it eats etc.

- No glue, sticky tape, staples or paper clips to be used
- Take no longer than one hour, including practising techniques

British Science week is the 10 - 19th March.

This year's STEM point challenge is to 'Create a Bird'. If any pupils are interested in taking part please see the information above. You will need to take pictures of your creations (max 3) and share them with me on your Google Drive. Pictures should be labelled with your name and class. There will be a winner from each class.
