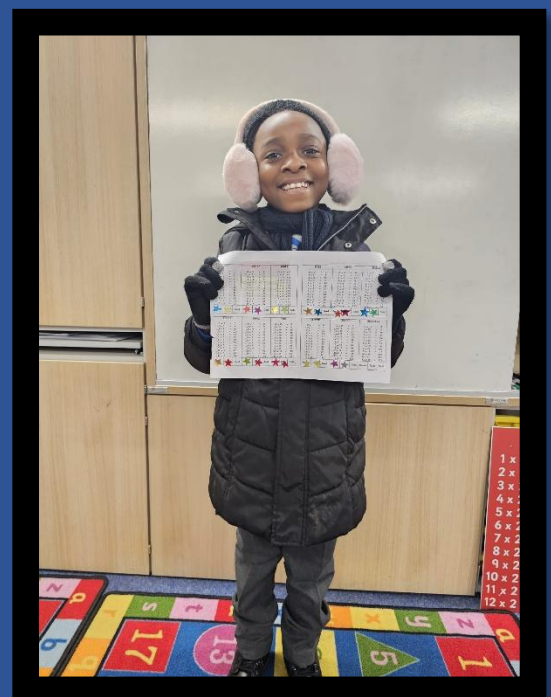
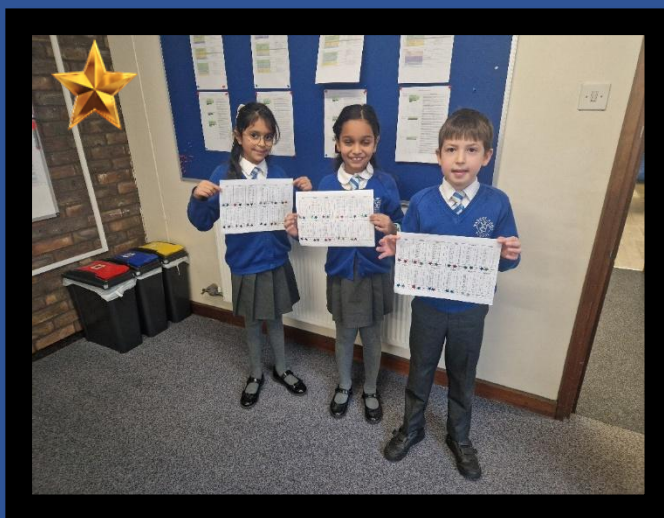
All the items will be donated to Watford Food Bank, who will distribute them to families who are most in need this Christmas.

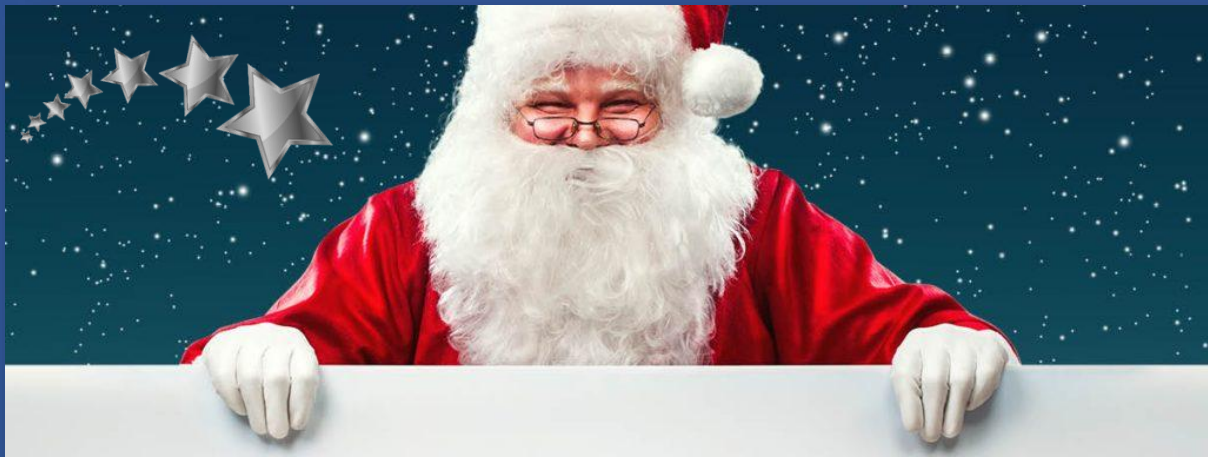
