

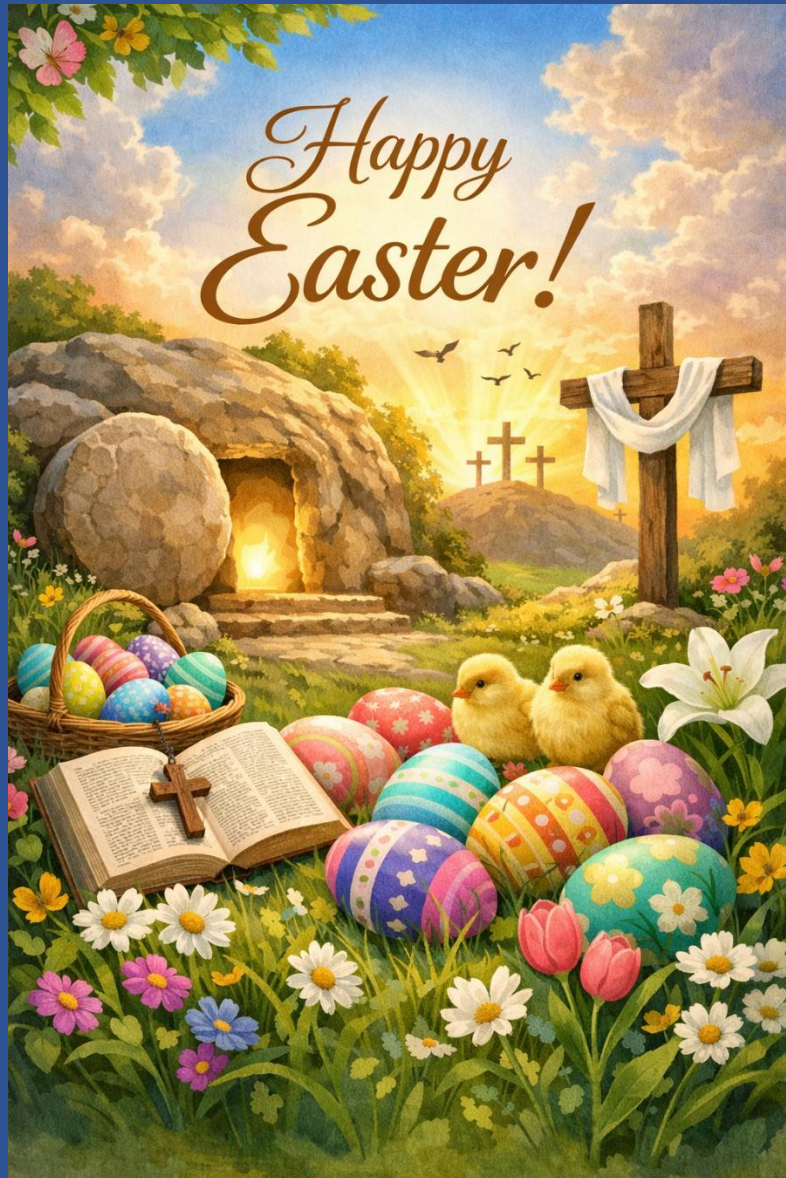

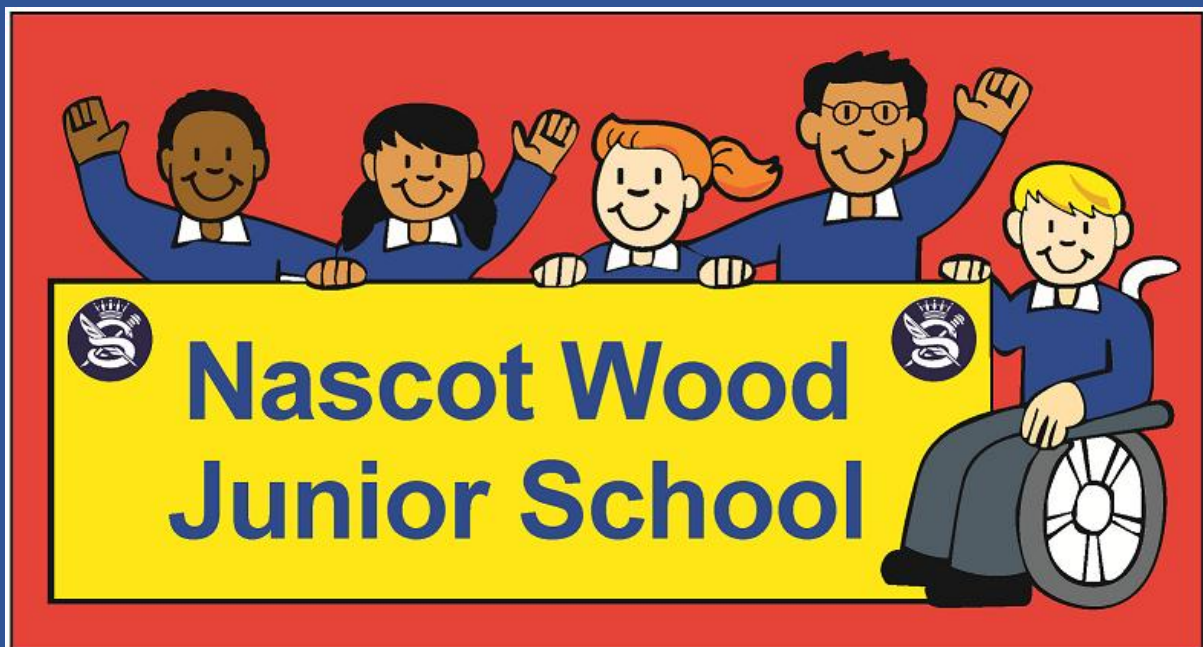
Many thanks to our editors, Tiaana and Zachary, for their excellent new edition of our school newspaper.
