

The Government is spending over £450 million on improving physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools over the 3 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016. A typical primary school with 250 primary aged pupils will receive £9,250 per year. Below is an outline of how we are spending/intend to spend the money.
